Dear Ambassadors,

In the framework of the **Erasmus+ Capacity Building for Higher Education action (CBHE)**, we are very pleased to share with you the promising results achieved by the CBHE project "***Harmonization and Innovation in Central American Higher Education Curricula: Enhancing and Implementing the Regional Quality Framework (HICA)***", that was implemented in Costa Rica, Panama, Nicaragua, Guatemala, El Salvador and Honduras from 15/10/2015 to 14/10/2018.

This **Structural Project**<sup>1</sup> (the first one implemented in Latin America) aimed at supporting reform, innovation and harmonisation of the higher education curricula in

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<sup>1</sup> The CBHE action distinguishes two types of projects: "Joint Projects" that aim at having an impact on the Higher Education Institutions, and "Structural Projects" that aim to have an impact on the Higher Education system and must therefore include the mandatory participation of the relevant National Authorities in the Partner countries concerned.

Central America. Its main outcome has been the **development of a Central American Qualifications Framework for Higher Education ("MCESCA")** that should contribute to the transparency, relevance and compatibility of each higher education cycle in the countries concerned.

The project coordinated by the Universidad of Barcelona was implemented by a wide consortium composed of 34 partners including Higher Education Institutions, Ministries of Education, University Associations and regional organisations from the above mentioned countries.

You will find in annex a short description of the project, its main outputs and the contact details of the coordinator and the project partners in your country.

Given the remarkable results achieved by the project and the active contribution of the National Authorities to these results, we believe it could be an example of good practice and an excellent reference for showcasing the added value of Erasmus+ and more generally of the EU support to (higher) education in your country.

### ERASMUS+ Capacity Building in Higher Education (CBHE)

#### *Harmonization and Innovation in Central American Higher Education Curricula: Enhancing and Implementing the Regional Quality Framework (HICA)*

561531-EPP-1-2015-1-ES-EPPKA2-CBHE-SP

#### **Aim of the project:**

HICA, driven by university associations, universities and ministries in six Central American (CA) countries, intended to support the reform, innovation and harmonisation of Higher Education curricula by developing a **Central American Qualifications Framework for Higher Education** ("MCESCA"). This Qualifications Framework defines what a student should know, understand and be able to do after each Higher Education cycle.

#### **Main outcomes and impact achieved:**

- Thanks to the **development of a MESCA**, the project has defined learning outcomes for pre-bachelor and short-cycle programmes.
- The Central American Qualifications Framework has been the object of a ***pilot in Central American Partner Universities***, with the aim of revising and reforming the learning programmes selected by each University, and of defining workload based learning outcomes aligned with the MCESCA.
- The pilot outcomes and the MCESCA itself were **promoted widely** to regional and national political bodies, employers and accreditation agencies.

Overall, the **impact achieved** by the project could be very significant in the region:

- The revised academic programmes have **brought together public authorities, students and teaching staff** and led to the implementation of curricular reforms.
- Central American universities have **networked and reinforced their regional cooperation capacity**.
- National associations and the Ministries of Education will benefit from a **regionally agreed tool** they can use for **quality assurance and teaching reforms** for their own systems as well as for the recognition of studies abroad.
- The **European partners** have benefitted from discussions on qualification frameworks in a Central American context that will provide them with an **important mirror for similar reforms** in the context of the Bologna Process.
